To all of our 65,000+ members (thats parents, carers and families, staff and students of Tassie's state schools), thank you for your ongoing support throughout the year. We have made great strides forward and have much planned for the year ahead. Enjoy your summer everyone and we will see you when school returns in 2022.



A lot of people haven't heard of TASSO. Those that have heard of us, usually aren't all that sure what we do, and you know what, we understand. There is our day to day work, projects we take on and support we offer to the community.

TASSO exists for the community. For the parents, families, carers of the children and the children themselves. That is a cause we have believed in continuously since 1945. The state government agrees with us and fund us accordingly.

Groups we've met with - we take advantage of other like-minded groups in our space to broaden our capacity to support our members in more ways. A couple of examples include the Tasmanian School Canteen Association (now called School Food Matters) who are working towards healthier food options in our school for all students. Another is PFLAG (Parents Family and Friends of Lesbians and Gays) who help us enhance our knowledge in that space and apply it directly when supporting families and the right to education for all students no matter their gender or sexuality.

Schools visits - TASSO makes school visits on request regularly to educate the school association committees on:

- Governance and how to run an effective committee
- · Best practices when it comes to internal conflict resolution
- Any individual concerns voiced by the committee or any member of the school association (any family/carer/community member/staff) who wishes to talk with us.

Ministers, Shadow Ministers and their advisers - TASSO are in regular contact with the Minister for Education, their advisors as well as other supporting staff at the Department of Education. We act as a conduit for communication, so the community can have their voices heard through us and the Department can provide the community with the most up to date information to help minimise speculation and uncertainty.

Regional meetings - A regular feature of TASSO's that consist of direct face to face presentations in each region of the state (South/North/North-West) on a subject of importance to educate and empower the community. When it's possible we also make an effort to get guest speakers to cover alternate content that holds relevance in the education arena. A good example of this was when Wendy from the Alannah and Madeline Foundation came to talk to us about eSmart - a program being used by nearly all schools to keep our students safe when online.

Empowering students - our belief in education - As TASSO is funded solely by the government we only have a limited amount of funds. This means we can't afford to just throw money at a total website reconstruction. To be a little thrifty we sought out some free programs that served two purposes - 1. Provide TASSO with a quality product at no cost. 2. Give university students a real-world experience where they get to show their skills and come up with a finished product.

In 2021 TASSO has been involved in three of these programs.

This helps TASSO to stay functional and relevant without taking funding away from our members.

Finally, TASSO will do anything for our members. If you come to us with a problem, we won't drop it, we will follow through. We stand by our members in their time of need and there have been plenty of them since the establishment of TASSO back in 1945. To families and carers, the problem they are facing doesn't always have a clear path to resolution, or there may not be a path yet. That's what we are here for, to use our knowledge and experience to take the load and help find a way through the barriers.

This is what we see as our purpose above all else. All the other stuff is a bonus.

Changes to Reporting

Following the 2020-21 Review into Reporting to Families, new reporting requirements will begin implemented in Tasmanian Government Schools (Kindergarten to Year 10) from 2022. The new reporting requirements will support the partnership between families and schools with a focus on more regular, timely feedback and communication about a child's learning progress and achievement. Further information about the changes will be shared with School Associations and families from the beginning of 2022.

We will be sharing a communications package with schools at the start of the school year in 2022 that they can share with families to introduce the new reporting requirements. We also took on board your suggestion to 'drip feed' the information to be shared with families so that our key messages are spread across the year.

2021 External Assessments

- 8-19 November 2021- Written exam period.
- 15 December 2021 Results released.
- 2 January 2022 Applications close for first-round requests to inspect written exams (Year 12 and 13 students only).
- 1 February 2022 Applications close for second-round requests to inspect written exam material (all students who did not submit a first-round request).
- 29 April 2022 Applications close for requests for a copy of written exams to be returned to you.
