Suspensions were a topic that hit the headlines this month. Comparing higher numbers in 2021 to the previous interrupted year. We met with Department of Education Secretary, Tim Bullard, and was quite content with his response to conduct a review into the suspensions, collect more data, look for similarities/patterns and look at alternative options. Consent

The three Rs have become four: reading, writing, arithmetic - and, now, respect.

About \$19m will be spent teaching Aussie kids respect in the classroom, while a national survey will be undertaken asking students about their views on consent.

Under the Engaged Schools program, \$7.2m will be "invested in measures that support inclusive, respectful school classroom environments so teachers can help their students to achieve their full potential and improve education outcomes".

Another \$5m will be given to the Australian Human Rights Commission to undertake a national survey of secondary school-age students on important issues related to consent education.



Tassie Writing Workshops 2022 By Kym Lardner

Do you sometimes ask yourself...
'What extra could I do for my advanced students?

Here is your answer.

In a one hour session, at the school, with 10 bright kids gathered around him, Kym Lardner writes and illustrates a complete picture book using folded sheets of A4 paper and a glue stick. From scratch and right in front of the children, Kym uses the kids unique and spontaneously contributed ideas to create a brand new picture book. They watch as he draws the characters, writes the text and binds the pages of the book together. They watch as everything is processed by hand and by a brain with 40 years experience in children's publishing.

Kym leaves the kids with a little finished A5 sized book for the library, which they can photocopy many editions of, colour in, make their own version of and even sell to other kids.

Tiny publishing industries spring up all because a real published children's book author and illustrator, of considerable competence and talent, demonstrated this right in front of them. Every book is unique from session to session, from school to school because Kym only uses the ideas from the 10 kids in each group. It all begins by asking WHO,WHAT,WHEN & WHERE? Every story has this structure and every session with Kym includes his humour and the gentle approach he is famous for.

2022 BUDGET In summary

These gains may be costing you elsewhere.... but right now we'll focus on the kids.

This financial year in total we can expect funding of \$25.3b to be distributed to Australian schools.

- As part of this, \$62.4 million for projects that enable better student educational outcomes through the National School Reform Fund and the Non-Government Reform Support Fund.
- Funding for the Emerging Priorities Program will be increased to support projects that school communities to respond to emerging priorities in school education, including COVID-19 recovery.
- Respectful relationships, student wellbeing and mental health initiatives include:
- \$6 million to support the continued delivery of respectful relationship education materials for primary and secondary school students nationally
- \$6.1 million to support the development of new online safety educational materials for younger students in Years 1-4 by Life Education Australia
- \$5 million for the Australian Human Rights Commission to undertake a survey of secondary school-age students on issues related to consent education at school
- \$9.7 million for new projects to help teachers and school leaders better identify,
 understand and respond to the mental health and wellbeing needs of students, and
- \$7.2 million in measures that support teachers to foster inclusive, engaged and respectful school classroom environments.

Michael Ferguson, Minister for Infrastructure and Transport Try our buses for free: Delivering cost of living relief with free bus travel The Tasmanian Liberal Government remains focussed on matters Tasmanians really care about.

To alleviate the impact of current higher fuel prices, all public bus travel across the state will be free for five weeks - starting on Monday March 28.

The Tasmanian Government will foot the bill for this initiative, which has the dual purpose of supporting family budgets and encouraging commuters to switch from private car travel to public transport.

While higher fuel prices are due to global fuel market uncertainty, we understand the impact it is causing on cost of living pressures.

The Tasmanian Government heavily subsidises Metro and other private providers of public transport around the state. At this point, we see a temporary, highly attractive measure such as free bus travel as one option the Tasmanian Government can activate to ease cost of living pressures.

Importantly, it also encourages Tasmanians who aren't already in the habit of catching buses to give them a try and enjoy the convenience and price advantage. Congestion is assisted by this type of successful public transport "mode shift".

Fares will be free across all operators - school buses and general access buses - and across all fare types (adult, concession and students). The incentive starts on Monday 28 March and runs until the end of April.

Our heavily subsidised fares are already attractive when compared to the cost of running, insuring, maintaining and parking cars. However with this special incentive, this means an adult travelling on a Metro urban zone 1 trip will save \$5.60 a day. Travellers from Sorell to Hobart can save \$15.20 on a return trip, those travelling from Westbury to Launceston will pocket a benefit worth \$22.80 and from Port Sorell to Devonport \$27.80 for return trips.

Better still, bus passengers can read a book or do some work while travelling, and not have to worry about finding a place to park at the end of journey.

The Government will ask Public Transport operators to monitor and assess services during this special initiative due to the potential for significant new demand. We also thank passengers in advance for their patience if their preferred service becomes busy, particularly during peak periods.
