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

# SCHOOL ASSOCIATION COMMITTEE - AGENDA SUGGESTIONS FOR TERM 4

Like most school terms, there are always tasks that association committees need to complete, or progress and Term 4 is no different.

If your Association is due to hold their Annual General Meeting (AGM) in March of 2020, it is now time to start getting prepared and the following

Timeframe & checklist for Calling for Nominations, Holding Elections & Calling & Conducting an Annual General Meeting (AGM).

Please note this has been developed for School Associations whose

Association Year ends on March 31st, you will need to adjust the time frame to suit your School Association Year.

Term 4 - tasks to complete:

- Identify members due for retirement. (Those who were elected 2 years earlier or filled a casual vacancy as a representative in a position that would have naturally expired at the end of the current Association year. (Model Constitution clause 9.4b) Retiring members may re-nominate.
- Notify the Principal which members of the Committee are due to retire. ((Model Constitution Clause 9.3d)



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- Set a date for the closing of nominations and include it in the communication strategy. Remember to allow enough time to:
- conduct a ballot if there are more nominations than vacant positions,
- call for more nominations if insufficient were received to fill all the vacant positions.
- Determine a process for conducting a ballot if more nominations are received than positions vacant.
- Develop a communication strategy for calling for nominations which informs all members of the school community (Association). For example, social media, school newsletter, emails or notes home.

The communication should include:

- the number of and type of vacancies to be filled (i.e. parent representative, staff representative, community representative)
- how to get a representative nomination form and what is required to complete it
- the closing date for nominations and where to lodge completed nomination forms
- the process for conducting an election if necessary.
- Principal to appoint Returning Officer. (<u>Secretary's Instruction No 7</u> point 3.7)
- Returning Officer is to
- publicise the calling for nominations as per the prescribed communication strategy
- receive nominations
- Check that the Auditor appointed at the previous AGM is still available to audit the Association's financial records, other information they might require and how much time they will require to complete the Audit. This will assist with having an audited financial report ready for the AGM.

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Specified Officeholders: Elections for the roles of Chairperson, Deputy Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer are conducted at the first meeting after the AGM. Officebearers are only elected of one year. Most school associations conduct their first Committee Meeting immediately after the AGM.

It's coming up to that time of year again - so here is a little chocolatey treat you may like to make with your children - young and old



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- 1 cup (80g) desiccated coconut
- 1/4 cup (40g) gluten-free icing sugar
- 150g white chocolate
- 50g copha, melted
- 100g white chocolate, melted, extra
- 100's & 1000's, to decorate
- Red and green smarties to decorate

### METHOD

- **Step 1** Cut 4 x 30cm squares of baking paper. Halve diagonally to make 8 triangles. Shape into cones, staple to secure.
- Step 2 Combine rice bubbles, coconut and icing sugar in a large bowl. Place the chocolate and Copha in a heatproof bowl over a saucepan of simmering water. Stir with a metal spoon for 3 mins or until chocolate melts and mixture is smooth. Add to rice bubble mixture and stir to combine. Spoon evenly among prepared cones and use the back of a spoon to press lightly. Place on a baking tray in the fridge for 1 hour or until firm.
- Step 3 Remove paper cones from chocolate crackles. Stand on a baking tray. Drizzle cones with extra melted chocolate. Sprinkle with 100's & 1000's. Dip freckles in extra chocolate and arrange on cone. Set aside to set.
