

Welcome back to Term 3!

There is a lot happening in the world of state school education at the moment. The Tasmanian State Government is undertaking an Inquiry into Discrimination and Bullying in Tasmanian Schools. If your child has experienced bullying, we encourage you to complete our survey to add to the collective parent voice.

Additionally, the Government is conducting a review into Education in Tasmania. The scope of this inquiry is currently unclear, TASSO will be involved in the review, we will continue to share opportunities to contribute to share parent voice.

In the School Association world, Term 3 is a great opportunity to reflect on any plans you had for 2024. Are they on track? Review the School Improvement Priorities post mid-year reports and check in on the school's targets with the question: is there any area that the School Association can help with? If you have a fundraising subcommittee, how are they tracking? Is there a plan for fundraised monies? Is there a school policy due for review? Term 3 is a good time to review the uniform policy or sports policy.

It's also a good time to start thinking about planning for 2025 and how to best use the Term 4 meeting to help add parent voice to the School Improvement Priorities in 2025.

For TASSO, May and June were spent meeting with Tasmanian politicians and meeting with members. TASSO President Krissy and I had the pleasure of attending the Queensland P&C conference and meeting with other state and territory versions of TASSO. It was a fabulous and informative weekend. We've also established regular meetings with ACARA, the body responsible for the Australian Curriculum, NAPLAN, and the My School website, to ensure that parent voice is reflected in their work.

We are continuing our advocacy for schools to be fully funded.

We are looking forward to seeing you at one of our online sessions or at the upcoming Special General Meeting and AGM.

Survey closes: 31 August 2024


